A detailed footing design including specific reference to the basement must be undertaken by a qualified engineer in accordance with the requirements of AS 2870 (Ref 3), the requirements of the AGS (Ref 2) and guidelines provided in the 'Report on Stability Assessment Proposed Dual Occupancy Development, 38 Wollongong Street, Shellharbour, by Douglas Partners dated 29 September 2005. Full details must be submitted to the Principal Certifying Authority prior to the commencement of any work.

Further that an extra condition be added that A Dilapidation Report detailing the current structural condition of the dwellings and associated structure located at No. 40 and 36 Wollongong Street, Shellharbour must be prepared and endorsed by a qualified structural engineer. The Director Operations & Services advised that initial consultation with an airconditioning consultant had determined that the installation of adequate airconditioning would cost approximately \$100,000 and therefore was not feasible. He also advised that any improvements to the Council's building would be subject to a Development Application. He had not been consulted regarding the government grant.

The General Manager advised that Council will consider this matter in the next couple of months as part of strategic planning deliberations.
